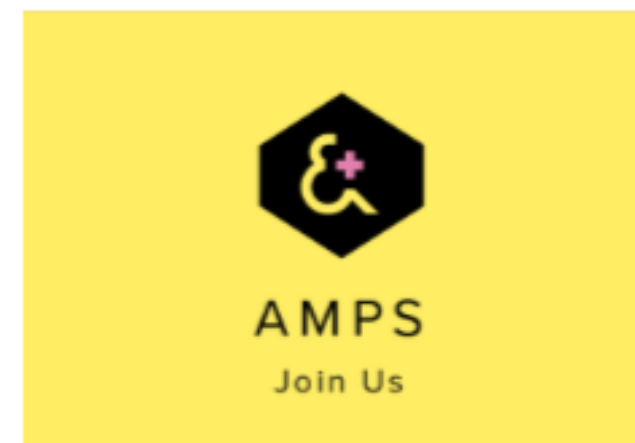

01 The McManus Art Gallery and Museum has a stunning exterior and is the place to explore Dundee's impressive global impact. 02 Dundee Contemporary Arts has everything under one roof - galleries, a two-screen cinema, print studio, restaurant, bar and cafe. 03 Verdant Works takes you back to Dundee's jute textile past, with recently refurbished cathedral-like High Mill. 04 Hannah MacLure Centre is an exhibition and cinema space within Abertay University. 05 University of Dundee hosts four galleries at Exhibitions at DJCAD, a museum collection, and LifeSpace, a science art research gallery. 06 Step onboard RRS Discovery to explore the famous polar expedition ship. 07 Then visit nearby HM Frigate Unicorn. 08 Dundee Rep Theatre and Scottish Dance Theatre produce and show world class performances. 09 Gardyne Theatre and 10 Caird Hall both offer a range of music, theatre and comedy. Dundonians asked to tell of their dreams for 2017

WE DUNDEE, the website which helped people power support Dundee's UK City of Culture 2017 bid, has been relaunched.

In the run-up to Dundee being shortlisted for the prestigious award, We Dundee displayed the answers of 2,331 people to the question "What would you love to see in 2017?"

Now organisers have relaunched We Dundee and this time they want backers to complete the phrase "In 2017 I would love to see..."

The team has already collected some ideas from an event at the Blue Skies festival.

"When you launch something like this, you're never sure what you're going to get," organiser Lyall Bruce said.

"Some people have really simple ambitions and some you're never going to get."

"I like the one about having a festival of flags across the city."

When We Dundee last asked the public to say what they think about their home town, organisers had set themselves a

target of 2,017 and were overwhelmed by the response.

Lyall said: "We were surprised by how much positivity there was."

"When you give people space it's really encouraging to see how many positive things they say."

Stewart Murdoch, who is leading the Dundee campaign, added: "The feedback we received from the We Dundee site was one of the key reasons the city's bid has been shortlisted. The depth and range of contribution from so many members of the public was astonishing and genuinely impressed the competition's judges."

"I'm sure this next phase will be just as effective and I really look forward to seeing the imaginative ideas and suggestions that come in."

We Dundee now wants to get as many ideas as possible by the end of the month to work into the City of Culture final stage bid document.

However, they hope the site will run beyond the bid.

"The We Dundee site isn't exclusively for the City of Culture bid," Lyall said.

"We came up with the whole idea of the site to gain some encouragement from people in the city and give them a voice."

At Dundee City Council. Stephen Kyle is leading a ground-breaking redesign of the city's public services.

Service Design can be a tricky concept to explain, but it's actually really important to everything we do. Service design is just that, how we design the services we use – from schools to housing to your bus timetable. 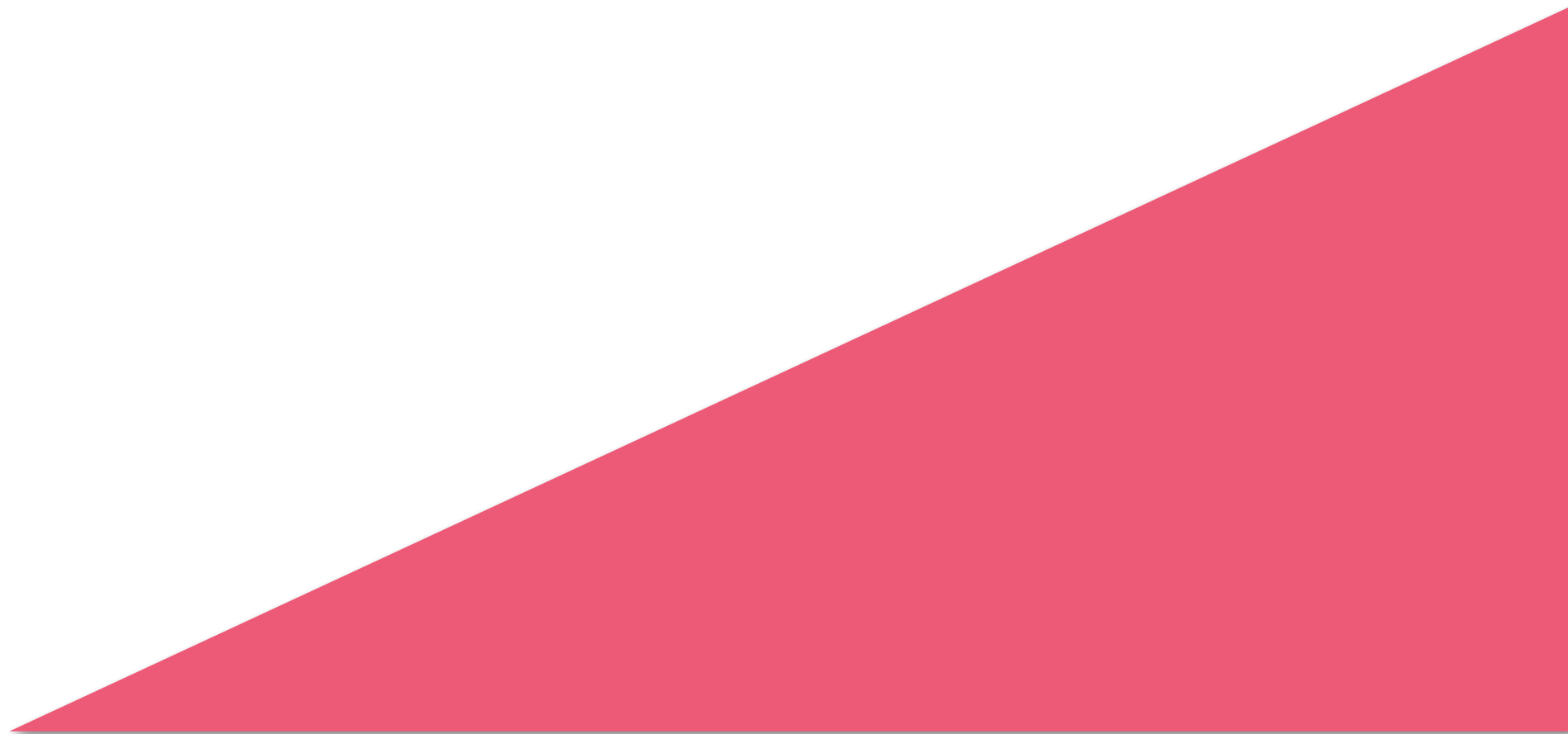

They could help you mock up new ideas, give you thoughts on your branding, help design an aspect of your behind the scenes operations and much more...

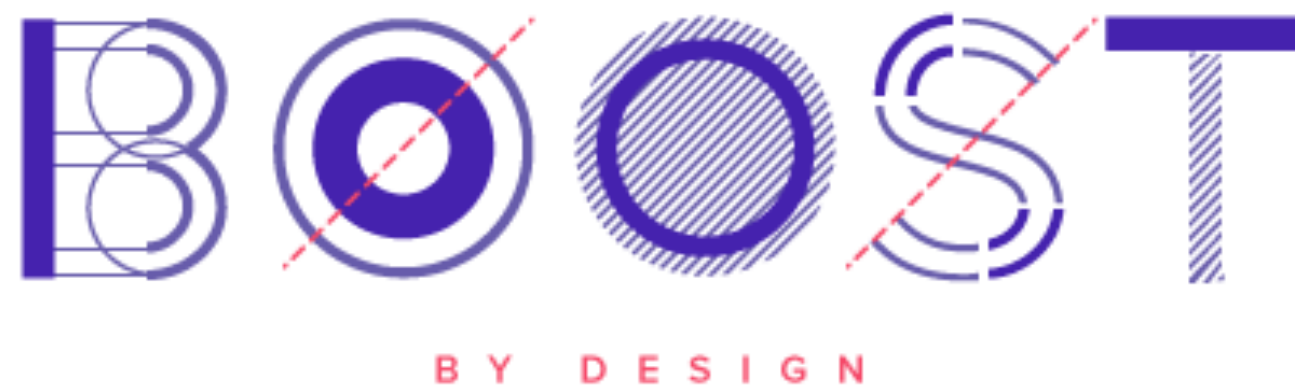
