


Crowdsourced City Guide 2019: Recommended by the people who live here and love it.



Places to stroll and see

The top of the Law, our extinct volcanic plug, is the best for panoramic views over Dundee. Perthshire. Angus and Fife, and take a stroll along **(**) Dighty Burn. Wander along 1 Riverside at sunset and admire the Tay Rail Bridge, visit the
 Riverside Nature Park and
 Dundee Botanic Gardens, then head to (1) Maggie's Centre to admire world renowned architect, Frank Gehry's impressive building, from the outside only. Cycle the Green Circular, 27 mile route around the city. (2) Tayview Community Garden and 8 Ninewells Community Garden are also perfect for a visit. If you like street art or appreciate a good statue, take the Open/Close street art trail in the doorways of the city centre and Stobswell, (20) Oor Wullie, (20) Oor Besperate Dan and Minnie the Minx, (2) O Dundee's Penguins, get a takeaway drink or sandwich at 🚳 🛽 The Auld Tram. then 8 1 Bash Street, and 8 9 the Lemmings! 6 Enjoy Slessor Gardens Discovery Walk and take in Sharing Not Hoarding, an experimental public art project. Visit Dundee Urban Orchard and stroll along the waterfront. Then, walk or cycle over the bridge to Fife and discover Kinshaldy Beach at Tentsmuir which is stunning and has to be one of the UK's best, it's on route to St Andrews. (B) Get a day pass on the Number 73 bus and spend your day visiting a trio of great sandy beaches in Carnoustie. Monifieth and Broughty Ferry - have a pint in the Fisherman's, an ice-cream in Visocchi's. explore Barnhill Rock Gardens, Broughty Ferry Castle and take a Pirate Boat to see the dolphins in the Tay Estuary. Arrr. Don't miss the Outdoor Explore Kayaking and the Sidlaw Hills behind Auchterhouse are brilliant for endless

(1) The McManus Art Gallery and Museum has a stunning exterior and is the place to explore Dundee's impressive global impact. @ Dundee Contemporary Arts has everything under one roof - galleries, shop, a two-screen cinema, print studio, restaurant and Jute Cafe Bar. (3) Dundee Rep Theatre and Scottish Dance Theatre produce and show world class performances. (4) Verdant Works takes you back to Dundee's jute textile past. Step onboard I RRS Discovery to explore the famous polar expedition ship. Then visit nearby i HM Frigate Unicorn, and while you're there get active with Foxlake. @ Dundee Museum of Transport tells the stories of local transport pioneers and innovators. B Gardyne Theatre, W Whitehall Theatre and C Caird Hall offer a range of music, theatre and comedy. Visit (1) Dundee Science Centre for hands-on learning, and (2) Dundee Central Library's varied programme and resources. B University of Dundee has a few exhibitions available in spaces: (1) (1) Cooper Gallery (1) (1) D'Arcy Thompson Zoology Museum and (1) (1) the exhibitions in the Tower Foyer & Lamb Galleries. For visual art exhibitions often featuring local artists, check out
 GENERATORprojects and the window-based (Nomas* Projects. Then, explore Scotland's first Design Museum, (6) V&A Dundee!

Some of the many festivals to check out include: March – Dundee Women's Festival; May – Dundee Design Month and Dundee Design Festival (biennial), Degree Shows; June – Dundee WestFest; July - Dundee Summer Streets Festival; Sep – Dundee Pride, Dundee Flower and Food Festival; Oct – Festival of the Future, Discovery Film Festival, Dundee Science Festival; Nov – NEoN Digital Arts Festival, Dundee Jazz Festival, Christmas Light Nights.
