

## Parks and gardens

Dundee is Scotland's sunniest city, with lots of green and growing spaces to wander to and through on those bright days. Some include (1) **Balgay Park**, with Mills Observatory, Victoria Gardens and great views. Stop by the grand pavilion in (2) **Baxter Park**, wave to the swans, ducks and model boats at (3) **Swannie Ponds**, and don't miss the cherry blossoms at (4) **Dawson Park**! At (5) **Camperdown Country Park** you'll find a tree trail, Campy Growers and the Wildlife Centre, and (6) **Caird Park** is home to Mains Castle, Den o' Mains woodland and the Regional Performance Centre sports hub. Walk around the reservoir at (7) **Clatto Country Park** and watch the skaters at (8) **Dudhope Park**. Experience landscapes from around the world at (9) **Dundee Botanic Gardens** and the wildlife and walking routes of (10) **Templeton Woods**. Keep your eyes peeled for local flora and fauna at nature reserves, including (11) **Riverside**, (12) **The Miley** and (13) **Trottick Mill Ponds**.

Dundee' wonderful community garden network includes (14) **Duntrune Community Gardens**, (15) **Ninewells Community Garden**, (16) **Tayview Community Garden** (with the Wee Forest nearby) and (17) **The MAXwell Garden**. Visit growdundee.blog to discover gardens, urban orchards, allotments and foraging spots!

# **Explore more**

Admire the impressive exterior of (18) <u>Maggie's Centre</u>, designed by renowned architect Frank Gehry, and find out about local transport pioneers at (19) <u>Dundee Museum of Transport</u>. Join a lunch-club or take a class at (20) <u>Bharatiya Ashram Dudhope Multicultural Centre</u> and (21) <u>Dundee International Women's Centre</u>, and enjoy touring and community productions at (22) <u>Gardyne Theatre</u> and (23) <u>The Little</u> <u>Theatre</u>. Don't miss Dundee's ultimate view – head to the top of (24) <u>The Law</u> and experience a glorious panorama of the city, Perthshire, Angus, Fife and the Tay.

Get active with (25) Ancrum Outdoor Centre, (26) Change Centre

Dundee, (27) Dundee Ice Arena, (28) Avertical World and (29) Wild

Shore Dundee, or go for a run with (30a) Frontrunners LGBT group,
(30b) Roadrunners, (30c) Camperdown parkrun or (30d) Baxter Park

junior parkrun. Wee ones can burn energy at (31) popular play parks
including (31a) Castle Green, (31b) Camperdown's many play zones
and (31c) Roseangle. Try an (32) Open/Close street art trail in (32a)

Lochee, (32b) Stobswell or the (32c) City Centre to discover nooks
and crannies. The 26-mile (33a) Green Circular cycle route loops right
around the city, including right past (33b) Dundee Cycle Hub where you
can get bike advice – and did you know you can (33c) cycle or walk
along the Tay (or over!) all the way from the airport to Broughty Ferry
and beyond?


Embrace seaside life in the Ferry – explore (34) <u>Broughty Castle</u> <u>Museum</u> then visit (35) <u>Broughty Ferry Beach</u> to spot dolphins and sailboats, or go for a swim in the Tay before treating yourself to an ice cream or poke of chips. Wander along the Esplanade to find (36) <u>Barnhill Rock Gardens</u> then head to (and under!) the (37) <u>Seven Arches Viaduct</u> by the Dighty Burn.

# Take a day trip

There's more to explore just outside of Dundee! Take a trip across the bridge to (38) Newport-on-Tay, where you'll find Forgan Arts Centre and Tatha Gallery, or head to (39) Tayport for the Larick Centre and a walk through the spectacular Tentsmuir forest and beach. Further around the (40) North East Fife coast you can visit St Andrews, Craigtoun Country Park, Cambo Gardens, Kingsbarns Beach and the fishing villages of the East Neuk – make a stop at Bowhouse for a weekend market. Explore beautiful beaches along the (41) Angus coast from Monifieth and Carnoustie up to Lunan Bay and St Cyrus, with the stunning Arbroath Cliffs in between. Go to (42) Arbroath for the Signal Tower Museum and the house and gardens of Hospitalfield, alongside their contemporary art programme. Check out (43) Forfar for the Meffan Museum & Art Gallery and Forfar Loch. For (44) walks in Angus and Perthshire, try the Angus Glens, Backmuir Woods, Monikie Country Park, the Blue Door

Walk in Edzell and the Hermitage at Dunkeld. Don't miss stunning views from the hills of the Sidlaws, and visit the Cateran Ecomuseum – a museum without walls. UNESCO City of Craft (45) **Perth** is home to Perth Art Gallery, Perth Theatre, Perth Concert Hall, Perth Creative Exchange and more – go for a wander by the Tay around Branklyn Garden and the Norie-Miller Walk, or enjoy the view from the top of Kinnoull Hill.

## Take in the city's creativity

Explore fascinating insights into Dundee at the (46a) McManus Art Gallery and Museum, with more to find at their (46b) Barrack Street Collections Unit just along the road. (47) Dundee Contemporary Arts has everything under one roof – galleries, a two-screen cinema, print studio and family creative space. (48) **Dundee Rep Theatre and** Scottish Dance Theatre produce and show world-class performances, and (49) **Verdant Works** brings Dundee's jute textile history to life. Step onboard (50) **RRS Discovery** to explore the famous polar expedition ship, then head along the Waterfront to (51) **HMS Unicorn**, Scotland's oldest ship. Enjoy local and touring music, theatre and comedy at (52) Whitehall Theatre and (53) Caird Hall, and visit (54) Dundee Science **Centre** for interactive exhibitions and hands-on learning. The University of Dundee hosts exhibitions in the (55a) **Cooper Gallery** inside Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art & Design, (55b) D'Arcy Thompson **Zoology Museum**, (55c) **Tower Foyer and Lamb Galleries** and (55d) LifeSpace Science Art Research Gallery. Artist-run (56) **GENERATOR projects** often feature exhibitions by local and emerging artists, and nearby car-park based (57) Woosh Gallery is open 24/7. Drop by the (58) Keiller Centre to find (58a) NEON Digital Arts, art-vending machine (58b) Volk Gallery and (58c) Federation Gallery. See more art in the windows of (59) **Nomas\* Projects** and billboard panels of (60) **Sharing Not Hoarding**. Whatever you do, don't miss Scotland's design museum, (61) **V&A Dundee!** 

#### Go for a wander

Just a short walk from (62) <u>City Square</u>, several monuments nod to Dundee's creative past – visit (69a) **Oor Wullie**, (62b) **Bash Street**, (62c) the <u>Lemmings</u>, (62d) <u>Desperate Dan and Minnie the Minx</u>. Find neighbours from colder climates commemorated through the (62e) <u>Penguins</u> outside the historic Old Steeple and (63a) <u>Whale</u> sculpture at the (63b) <u>Urban Beach</u> – don't forget your bucket and spade! At (64a) <u>Slessor Gardens</u> you can celebrate the pioneering spirit of Dundonians

with the (64b) <u>Discovery Walk</u> and wander through themed pocket gardens. (65) <u>Public Art Dundee</u> has free online trails to introduce you to 50+ artworks across the city. Pause for a moment of quiet contemplation at (66) <u>The Howff</u>, (67) <u>Geddes Quadrangle</u>, (68) <u>WeeCAIR Medicinal Garden</u> and (69) <u>Urban Orchard</u>. Visit the bandstand at (70) <u>Magdalen Green</u> and explore Dundee's history with (71) <u>DD Tours</u>. Need a rest but still want to see the sights? Jump on the (72) <u>Discover Dundee open-top bus</u> between April and September!

### Make, learn and create

If you're looking for ways to get creative, try (73) <u>Double Door Studios</u>, (74) <u>Dundee Ceramics Workshop</u>, (75) <u>Dundee Art Society</u> and (76) <u>DCA Print Studio</u>. Spaces like (77) <u>Reboutique</u>, (78) <u>The Wardrobe</u>, (79) <u>ScrapAntics</u> and (80) <u>Art Angel</u> build community around creativity, sustainability and wellness. Visit Dundee's brilliant libraries, including (81) <u>Central Library</u>, for varied programmes and resources, and drop in to the (82) <u>ScrapStore</u> and the (83) <u>Community Toolbox</u> at Wellbeing Works to borrow, reuse and recycle.

## Creative spaces, live music, festivals and events

Here are a few of the organisations and events that keep the city creative as the UK's only (84) <u>UNESCO City of Design</u>. (85) <u>Wasps Studios</u> hosts over 75 artists and makers at Meadow Mill. (86) <u>University of Dundee</u>, (87) <u>Abertay University</u> and (88) <u>Dundee & Angus College</u> all have leading art and design courses, with degree shows in spring. (89) <u>Hotchpotch</u> presents monthly open mics for writers, (90) <u>Shaper/Caper</u> throw shapes and have fun through critically-acclaimed performances and (91) <u>Icebreaker Comedy</u> hold regular nights at venues across the city centre.

See local and touring bands at (92) <u>Conroy's Basement</u>, (93) <u>Beat</u> <u>Generator</u> and (94) <u>Clarks on Lindsay Street</u>, catch live music, clubs or drag at (95) <u>Church</u>, and head to (96) <u>Kings</u>, (97) <u>Duck Slattery's</u> and (98) <u>POUT</u> for a night out.

The city is home to lots of festivals and events – some to check out include: <u>Dundee Month of Design</u>; <u>Dundee Design Festival</u>; <u>Dundee Women's Festival</u>; <u>Dundee Comic Con</u>; <u>Dundee Dance Event</u>; <u>Dundee WestFest</u>; <u>Dundee Summer Streets Festival</u>; <u>Dundee Pride</u>; <u>Dundee Graffiti Jam</u>; <u>Arcadia</u>; <u>Festival of the Future</u>; <u>Discovery Film Festival</u>; <u>Dundee Science Festival</u>; <u>Dundead Horror Film Festival</u>; <u>Dundee Fringe</u>; <u>Scottish Fashion Festival</u>; <u>16 Days of Activism</u>; <u>Dundee Hooley</u>; <u>Dundee Jazz Festival</u>; <u>Christmas in Dundee</u>; and <u>WinterFest</u>. Search online to find out what's happening next.

If you're planning a visit and have questions about accessibility, try peer-review sites <u>Euan's Guide</u> and <u>AccessAble</u> – two online databases where disabled people can share experiences and recommendations.
